Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back—I hope you have enjoyed the summer holidays and are ready for an exciting new year. I am really looking forward to the year ahead and to teaching you do with your children. Please do continue to read Year 6.

Maths

This term, we will be focusing on place value, specifically: numbers to 10 million; comparing and ordering any number; rounding numbers to 10, 100 and 1,000 and negative numbers.

We will then be moving onto the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Children will gain a deeper understanding of how to manipulate problems in context and will develop their understanding of written methods, as well as mental ones.

Furthermore, we will begin our fractions unit where we will start to compare and organise, simplify and recognise equivalence, as well as applying the four operations.

It is imperative that your child is practising and learning their times tables at home on a daily basis, this will underpin much of their learning this term.

English

Class novel: The place for me: Stories about the Windrush Generation.

Over the next few weeks Year 6 will learn to write an information leaflet about a period in Black history (this will be a hybrid text type including information, recount ing and science experiments! and explanation texts). We will be looking at how to enhance meaning through selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary. We will also be using modal verbs and adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility, as well as using brackets, dashes or commas to indicate parenthesis.

Reading in school

We will continue to send reading books home with reading records this term so we can share in the reading more difficult books to your child as well because sharing all levels of books and practising reading is so important. We are trying to help the children see that reading is fun, that it opens up whole new worlds and adventures for us, so if you can share books at home with your children in a fun and enjoyable way, that would really help support this idea. Reading is also vital for developing vocabulary, imagination and comprehension skills.

Topic—Maafa

This term, our topic is 'Maafa', which heavily focuses on history and geography. This project teaches children about Africa's past and present and the development of the slave trade. It also explores Britain's role in the transatlantic slave trade, the causes and consequences of the European colonisation of Africa and the worldwide communities that make up the African diaspora.

<u>Science—Circulatory System</u>

This project teaches children about the transport role of the human circulatory system, its main parts and primary functions. Children will learn about healthy lifestyle choices and the effects of harmful substances on the body.

This is a great unit of work, with lots of practical learn-

Art and DT Topics: Tints, tones and shades; Trailblazers and Barrier Breakers; Food for life.

RE:

In RE we will look at 'The Story of the People of God'.

Children will learn some of the stories of significant people in the Old Testament and will be able to discuss the relationship these people had with God. As well as the structure of the Bible and the forms of literature that are found in different books.

Following units: Celebrating the life of Mary and the Saints, Prayers in the lives of the followers of Christ, Advent.
